The Overscaig is an ideal base to explore all the attractions of the Northern Highlands, a landscape formed from the world's most ancient rock. An area rich in wildlife, birds, history & archaeology - superb for outdoor pursuits such as walking, cycling and fishing.

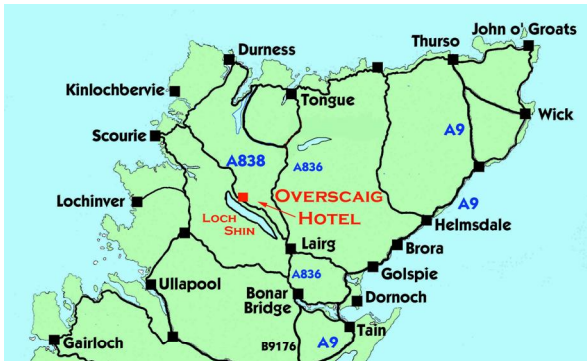
To get to this isolated spot you do, of course, have to travel quite a way - we are 1½ hours drive north of Inverness. Pass through Lairg, then turn on to the A838 to Durness. We are 17 miles from Lairg and its mostly single track road - so don't drive too fast!



Good home-cooking plays an important role at The Overscaig with Highland Venison, Aberdeen Angus Beef and fresh Haddock from Kinlochbervie served in our quiet dining-room overlooking Loch Shin. Finish your meal with our home-made ice-cream, superb bread & butter pudding or delicious local cheeses.

After dinner simply relax with coffee or liqueurs in our lounge, whilst preparing yourself for the following day's Sutherland adventures.

The Overscaig has 3 double rooms, 2 twin rooms, 1 single and 2 four-bedded "family" rooms, most have a loch view. Each is attractively furnished and has its own coffee/tea making facilities, direct dial telephone, as well as a TV (most have a DVD player).

This is wonderful region to explore, if you do stay in and around the hotel, we have a comfortable lounge with TV, video and DVD player, as well as a good supply of books and games for quiet relaxation.





Fishing in this remote region of Scotland attracts people from all over the world. The Overscaig is an ideal base to fish for wild brown trout, sea trout and salmon. We have boats on 3 lochs plus access to local river and hill lochs.

An area rich in wild life – catch a glimpse of pine marten or watch crossbills feeding in front of the hotel. See peregrine falcon hunting or an osprey diving on the loch. Alternatively, take a day trip to the nature reserves at Forsinard or Handa Island.

For walkers, the most northerly Munros are near by plus hills like Arkle, Foinaven and Ben Stack. Enjoy superb local walks to the UK's highest waterfall or Sandwood Bay.

Experience the tranquillity of this remote wilderness area, then simply relax in the hotel overlooking Ben More Assynt and enjoy our Highland hospitality.



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
